Her favourite Special Olympics moment was seeing the athletes develop their skills, establish friendships and creating long lasting memories at the athlete leadership camp Mt Buller.


She thought the entire GREAT tour was incredible. But seeing so many different athletes of different ages from regional areas was a definite highlight.

THE CHIEF'S CHALLANGE

Law Enforcement Torch Run Victoria patron Chief Commissioner Shane Patton recently launched the 3rd annual 'Chief's Challenge'. Following the success of the last two years the Chief is once again challenging all Victoria Police staff to plan an activity which demonstrates our commitment to meaningful engagement with the intellectually disabled community. The challenge takes place is the lead up to International Day of People with a Disability on December 3 each year. We are keen to see what innovative ideas are used to celebrate the day.

Covid-19 hampered efforts to celebrate in 2020 but 105 Victoria Police staff supported and connected with over 615 people is the disability sector taking part in the activities. Events included virtual torch runs, and specialist schools visits. These events helped build stronger connections between Victoria Police and people in our community with disabilities.

CONGRATULATIONS CHELSEA!!

LETR is a global organisation with 110,000 law enforcement employees from more than 40 countries involved every year. The LETR International Executive Council has delegates from the 14 LETR regions overseeing all of the LETR global activities and one athlete representing all 5.6 million Special Olympics athletes from around the world.

Victorian Athlete Leader Chelsea Haag-Witherden was nominated to stand in the LETR International Executive Council elections as one of only 9 athletes shortlisted from around the world.

She presented to the International Executive Council and blew them away just like we knew she would. It was a tough challenge as she was up against strong and worthy nominees for the Council to choose from.

We are so incredibly proud to announce Chelsea has been elected as the athlete representative on the International Executive Council!! This is only the second time an athlete from outside North America has been selected in LETR's 40 year history. It is an amazing achievement.

Chelsea is an incredible young woman who embodies all that can be achieved through Special Olympics. We know she will be an outstanding ambassador for all athletes and are proud to call her part of the Special Olympics and LETR Victoria family.
